# Principal/Vice-Principal Report

# Student update

- The 10K Grant for tech art related project for 3D printers is moving ahead
- Grade 8s doing a virtual workshop with Bruce Blackburn (Juno-award nominated artist) Black History Month, oriented around music
- Grade 7s are currently doing scientists in the school, building projects, and took the school's first trip by doing outdoors learning, studying environmental interactions



- Badminton training happening (with nets)
- Hope that inter-school sports will resume shortly

#### Principles update

- COVID status update
  - 4 active cases
  - Maximum amount of cases at one time has been 7 cases
  - School is responding to lots of questions from parent community
  - Impacted class is informed every time there is a case
  - New rapid antigen tests and KN95s are being sent out
  - School is working through the SAC provided masks; no further masks required
- o Automated door installed and up next is a ramp to ensure accessibility for entry into school

#### Music and dance

- Dance program in spring reaching out to get info about a professional dancer to come in spring and offer classes
- Music program opportunity to bring back DJ Adam but will discuss in April/May
- Bring forward at future SAC with quorum
- Urgent ask: Get Real workshop
  - Workshop is cohort-based and delivered by an LGBTQ+ organization that focuses on racism, discrimination, and bullying, goal is to break down prejudice, promote unity, and foster compassion/empathy
  - Program is like essentially a virtually counselling program, with post-workshop follow-up with smaller groups
  - Ask to the SAC would be \$1250 for every grade from grade 2-8 would participate in the workshop
  - Request is urgent as they book up quickly
  - Principal Ellis will move ahead and ask in future for SAC support (e.g. 50/50 cost coverage)
  - Also looking at a parent workshop

#### Treasurer's Report

Itemized review



- Mask funding: Received \$1,525 for the mask program. About \$395 from what was fundraised is left over.
- o **Spirit wear:** Spirit wear money, from last year, has been deposited
- o Arts/enrichment: There is still money in that 4000 for the arts allocation (about \$2,050)
- Scientists in school: We are treating as spent money as we've moved ahead with it
- Ask for Get Real workshop SAC can pull from leftovers from other programs and miscellaneous budget (but need SAC to support)
  - o Ben to put \$650 in yellow as to be approved
  - o Bottom line our enrichment budget is over but overall budget is underspent
- Previously discussed spirit wear campaign: table it to the fall/new school year given last campaign was so
  recent and expect not as much interest for gear at this time
- Motion to approve extra \$250+HST to cover shortfall for PRoGrant Anti-Racism Workshop
  - Alexis Dawson runs an anti-racism workshop for broader community (parents/guardians) and a smaller group with Principal Ellis, group of teachers, and select SAC members to help inform the School Statement of Need document
  - o Dates would be for May 4th for the wider group and May 31st for small group
  - o Motion was carried by executive as all were in attendance.
- Events Update (and discussion)
- Principal Ellis noted there is a need for an event, ideally pre-March break, to increase morale, potentially outdoors (e.g. a snow dance)
- Kitty noted that previously discussion had started down the path of a hot chocolate outside event
- SAC discussed a tie-in to Olympics (e.g. stations)
- Principal Ellis will reach out to staff to assess support, note SAC support for covering hot chocolate. Parents could support as well and participate.

# **Enrichment Update**

- Received \$1200 for flip-grid which will enable reading challenge going from Feb-May
- Each division will get \$100 with teachers deciding on how to use the prize money, all JK/SK kids will get prize
- Going to reach out to division reps to see if teachers will tie into Google classroom as parents likely check classroom more than SAC website

# Other Business & Adjournment

#### Teacher/staff appreciation

- Chair noted that pre-covid there was a potluck, but there could be some other appreciation for the teachers as cannot host pot-luck due to covid
- Ideas raised included:



- Coffee and donuts for a couple of Fridays, prebagged for each teacher small, sustainable, easy to meet dietary restrictions, easier to manage that a potluck. Caitlin could coordinate and survey teachers
- Fancy fruit selection
- o Flowers or succulents for each
- Costs for coffee/donuts in past: previously, for a staff of about 45, buying 2 jugs of coffee/tea and pastries would total about \$150-\$200, so for 4 months could be in the \$600 range
- We can sort out finding non-SAC funding offline in a way that conforms with SAC board rules
